

CATEGORIES – LIANHE ZAOBAO WINE REVIEW CHALLENGE 2007

SPARKLING

1. Non-Vintage Champagne (SP1)

2. Vintage Champagne (SP2)

Includes Vintage & Prestige Vintage champagnes (SP2)

3. Sparkling Wine (SP3)

Includes French and non-French sparkling wines. Can be either Non-Vintage or Vintage, white, rosé or red.

WHITE

1. Sauvignon Blanc (W1)

Includes French Sancerre & Pouilly Fume • Touraine and other Loire Valley Sauvignon Blanc • Vin de Pays Sauvignon Blanc • New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc • Australia Sauvignon Blanc • South Africa Sauvignon Blanc • Chile Sauvignon Blanc • Argentinian Sauvignon Blanc • California Sauvignon Blanc & Fumé Blanc • Sauvignon Blanc wines from any other part of the world.

2. Unoaked Chardonnay (W2)

Chablis of any level (whether Villages, Premier Cru or Grand Cru, provided it is not oaked) • Unoaked Chardonnay from any other part of France and the Old & New World, including Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California, Chile, Argentina, etc.

3. Oaked Chardonnay (W3)

Burgundy such as Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Chassagne-Montrachet, Saint Aubin, Pernand Vergelesses, etc. • Vin de Pays Oaked Chardonnay • Oaked Chardonnays from Italy • Spain • California • Chile • Argentina • South Africa • New Zealand • Australia • and any other part of the World.

4. Dry Bordeaux White (W4)

Includes Entre deux Mers, Bordeaux Blanc, Bordeaux Blanc Superieur, whether the wine is a brand (such as B&G, Mouton-Cadet, Dourthe, etc.) or of a chateau. Also includes Bordeaux whites from Pessac Leognan and Graves.

5. Riesling (W5)

German Riesling (provided it's not Spatlese, Auslese, Beerenauslese or Trockenbeerenauslese or Eiswein) • Alsace • Austria • Italy • Australia • New Zealand • South Africa, etc.

6. Old & New World Other White Varietals & Blend (W6)

Including Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California, Chile, Argentina, France, Italy, Spain, etc. But must be dry wines.

RED

1. Branded Bordeaux Red (R1)

Red Bordeaux wine such as Mouton-Cadet, Premier de Lichine, J P Mouiex, B&G, Dourthe, Beau Rivage, etc., BUT MUST NOT BE A CHATEAU WINE (please refer to next category).

2. **Bordeaux Chateau Red (R2)**

Chateau wine from throughout Bordeaux including Medoc, Haut-Medoc, Saint-Estephe • Pauillac • Saint-Julien • Listrac • Moulis • Margaux • Graves • Pessac Leognan, Saint-Emilion, Pomerol, Côtes de Blaye, Côtes de Bourg, Côtes de Castillon, and Côtes de Francs • Montagne-Saint-Emilion, Lussac-Saint-Emilion, Puisseguin-Saint-Emilion, Saint-Georges-Saint-Emilion • Lalande-de-Pomerol, Fronsac, Canon-Fronsac, etc. MUST BE A CHATEAU WINE .

3. **Pinot Noir (R3)**

Including Burgundy and 100% Pinot Noir from other parts of France and other Old World & New World regions and countries.

4. **Beaujolais Villages & Beaujolais Crus (R4)**

Including Fleurie, Brouilly, Moulin-a-Vent, Regnie, etc.

5a. **Northern Rhone (R5N)**

Including Cote Rotie • Hermitage • Crozes Hermitage • Saint-Joseph • Cornas, etc.

5b. **Southern Rhone (R5S)**

Including Chateauneuf-du-Pape and other Southern Rhone reds such as Cotes du Rhone Villages, Gigondas, Rasteau, Vacqueras, etc.

6. **New World Cabernet Sauvignon (R6)**

Including Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California, Chile, Argentina, etc.

7. **New World Shiraz (R7)**

Including Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California, Chile, Argentina, etc.

8. **New World Merlot (R8)**

Including Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California, Chile, Argentina, etc.

9. **Old & New World Other Red Varietals & Blend (R9)**

Including France, Spain, Portugal, Hungary, Austria, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, California, Chile, Argentina, etc.

10. **Vins de Pays Red (R10)**

Including Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Syrah, Blend, etc.

11. **Italian Red (R11)**

Including Valpolicella, Chianti, Gattinara, Vino Nobile di Montalcino, Brunello di Montepulciano, Barbaresco, Barolo, IGT wines, etc.

SWEET WINE

Sweet Wine & Fortified Sweet Wine (SW1)

1. Sauternes • Vouvray Demi-Sec & Moelleux • Bonnezeaux • Quarts des Chaume • Alsace Vendange Tardive and Selections des Grains Nobles wines • German Spatlese, Auslese, Beerenauslese and Trockenbeerenauslese • Ice wines from Germany, Canada, etc • Late Harvest Sweet Wines from Australia • New Zealand • South Africa • California • Chile, etc. Also includes fortified sweet wines such as Muscat de Beauges de Venise, Port, Sherry, etc.
